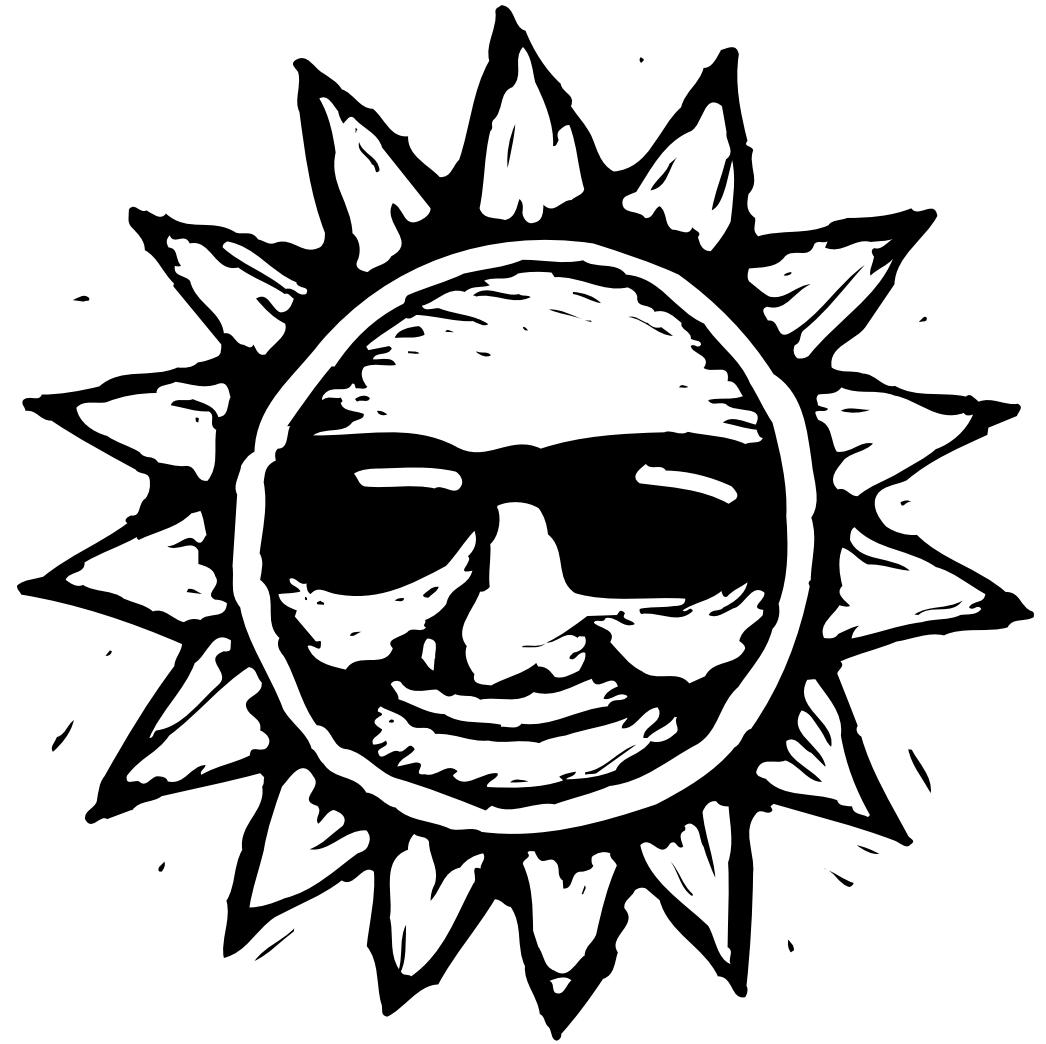
Seize the Story; A Handbook for Teens Who Love to Write by Victoria Hanley

Death of Jayson Porter by Jaime Adoff

In the Florida projects, sixteen-year-old Jayson struggles with the harsh realities of his life. An abusive mother, a drug-addicted father and not fitting in at his predominately white school bring him to the brink of suicide.

Chains by Laurie Halse Anderson

After being sold to a cruel couple in New York City, a slave named Isabel spies for the rebels during the Revolutionary War.

What I Saw and How I Lied by Joan Blundell

In 1947, teenage Evie has her jovial stepfather Joe back from the war and family life is returning to normal. Smitten by the handsome young ex-GI who seems to have a secret hold on Joe, Evie finds herself caught in a complicated web of lies that change her and her family's life forever.

Graceling by Kristin Cashore

In Katsa's world, some people are born with extreme and often-feared skills called Graces. She struggles for redemption from her own horrifying Grace, the Grace of killing and teams up with another young fighter to save their land from a corrupt king.

Hunger Games by Suzanne Collins

In a future North America, the rulers of Panem maintain control through an annual

televised survival competition pitting young people from each of the twelve districts against one another. Sixteen-year-old Katniss's skills are put to the test when she voluntarily takes her younger sister's place.

Musician's Daughter by Susanne Dun

In eighteenth-century Vienna, Austria, fifteen-year-old Theresa seeks a way to help her mother and brother financially. At the same time she investigates the murder of her father, a renowned violinist in Haydn's orchestra at the court of Prince Esterhazy.

Coraline by Neil Gaiman, illustrated by Craig Russell

Looking for excitement, Coraline ventures through a mysterious door into a world that is similar yet disturbingly different. There she must challenge a gruesome entity in order to save herself, her parents, and the souls of three others.

The Graveyard Book by Neil Gaiman, illustrated by Dave McKean

Nobody Owens is a normal boy, except that he has been raised by ghosts and other denizens of the graveyard.

Bad Girls Club by Judy Gregerson

As her mother spirals deeper into madness and her father denies there is a serious problem, Destiny struggles to keep herself and her five-year-old sister from

being overcome by the darkness that dwells in their house.

Night Road by A.M. Jenkins

Battling his own memories and fears, Cole, an extraordinarily conscientious vampire, and Sandor, a more impulsive acquaintance, spend a few months on the road, trying to train a young man who recently joined their ranks.

Out of the Pocket by Bill Konigsberg

As Bobby Framingham, quarterback of his high school football team, finally acknowledges to himself that he is gay, events start to spin out of control. His sexual orientation is revealed in the student newspaper and in the local press. Then, he learns that his father has cancer.

YA KRO

Venomous by Christopher Krovatin

Since age eight, New York City high school junior Locke Vinetti has experienced bouts of overpowering anger. Now that he has friends who accept him and a true girlfriend, "the venom" threatens to destroy all that he loves.

YA LIE

Gravity by Leanne Lieberman

Ellie Gold is an orthodox Jewish teenager living in Toronto in the late eighties. Ellie has no doubts about her strict religious upbringing until she falls in love with another girl. Aware that homosexuality clashes with Jewish observance, Ellie feels

forced to either alter her sexuality or leave her community.

YA MCK

Dragonhaven by Robin McKinley

Jake Mendoza lives in the Smokehill National Park where his father runs the Makepeace Institute of Integrated Dragon Studies. When Jake goes on his first solo overnight in the park, he finds an infant dragon whose mother has been killed by a poacher.

YA MUS

Door of No Return by Sarah Mussi

Zac never believed his grandfather's tales about their enslaved ancestors being descended from an African king. When his grandfather is murdered and the villains come after Zac, he sets out for Ghana to find King Baktu's long-lost treasure before the murderers do.

YA PRA

Nation by Terry Pratchett

A devastating tsunami destroys all that Mau, an island boy, and Daphne, an aristocratic English girl, have ever known. Together with a small band of refugees, they set about rebuilding their community and all the things that are important in their lives.

Here Lies Arthur by Philip Reeve

When her village is attacked and burned, Gwyna seeks protection from the bard Myrddin, who uses Gwyna in his plan to transform young Arthur into the heroic King Arthur.
