Beware!: R L Stine Picks His Favorite Scary Stories

Each opens with a brief introduction by the Goosebumps author and includes bewitching black and white illustrations.

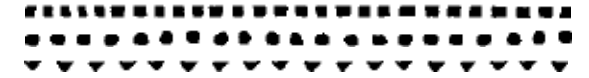
Growing Up In Slavery: Stories of Young Slaves as Told by Themselves
